## MIP SCHEME FOR STEEL INDUSTRY

\*277. SHRI R. DHRUVA NARAYANA: SHRI GAJENDRA SINGH SHEKHAWAT:

Will the Minister of STEEL be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the implementation of Minimum Import Price (MIP) scheme has been helpful in increasing the viability and profitability of the domestic steel industry and if so, the details thereof along with the extent to which it has helped the domestic steel industry;
- (b) whether the Government proposes to continue with the MIP scheme using it as a temporary measure to help the industry recover its outstanding loans and if so, the details thereof;
- (c) whether MIP scheme has received any backlash and if so, the details thereof along with the corrective steps taken by the Government in this regard; and
- (d) whether the Government has imposed/proposes to impose anti-dumping duty on countries indulging in dumping cheap steel in the country including China and if so, the details thereof?

DHRUVA NARAYANA AND SHRI GAJENDRA SINGH SHEKHAWAT, MEMBERS OF PARLIAMENT REGARDING "MIP SCHEME FOR STEEL INDUSTRY"

(a)&(b): Minimum Import Price (MIP) is a temporary measure to provide protection to domestic steel industry from predatory pricing of steel imports. Prices of steel goods after notification of MIP on 5<sup>th</sup> February, 2016 has shown favourable trend to domestic steel industry as mentioned below.

- (c) Some objections were received from some user industries and government has considered the same while imposing MIP.
- (d) Government has imposed preliminary anti-dumping duty on a number of steel products from other countries for a period of six months as per the following notifications:
- a) Notification No.44/2016-Customs (ADD) dated 8<sup>th</sup> August, 2016 imposing antidumping duty on Hot-rolled flat products of alloy or non-alloy steel falling under headings 7208, 7211, 7225 or 7226 originating in, or exported from People's Republic of China, Japan, Korea RP, Russia, Brazil and Indonesia.
- b) Notification No.45/2016-Customs (ADD) dated 17<sup>th</sup> August, 2016 imposing anti-dumping duty on Cold-Rolled flat products of alloy or non-alloy steel falling under headings 7209, 7211, 7225 and 7226 originating in, or exported from People's Republic of China, Japan, Korea RP and Ukraine.
- c) Notification No.51/2016-Customs (ADD) dated 2<sup>nd</sup> November, 2016 imposing anti-dumping duty on Wire Rod of Alloy or Non-Alloy Steel falling under headings 7213 and 7227 originating in, or exported from China.

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
