SHORTAGE OF RAW MATERIALS IN STEEL INDUSTRY

2796. SHRI RAJKUMAR DHOOT:

Will the Minister of STEEL be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that steel sector is facing severe shortage of raw material due to acute shortage of iron ore due to legal curbs and lukewarm policies of Centre and States;

- (b) if so, the details thereof; and
- (c) the remedial measures Government proposes to take in the matter?

ANSWER

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF (SHRI VISHNU DEO SAI) STEEL AND MINES

(a)&(b): No, Sir. There is no overall shortage of iron ore in the country. Regional shortages of iron ore have taken place in the states like Karnataka, Odisha & Jharkhand due to legal & regulatory issues. However, production of Iron ore in the Country is more than the requirement of domestic Steel Industry. Details of last three years' iron ore production & domestic consumption are given in the table below:-

(c) Iron & Steel is a deregulated sector. The role of the Government in a deregulated sector is that of a facilitator. In order to ensure sufficient availability of iron ore in the domestic steel sector fiscal measures have been adopted by Government to discourage export of iron ore by imposing an export duty of 30% ad valorem on iron ore and 5% ad valorem on iron ore pellets.
